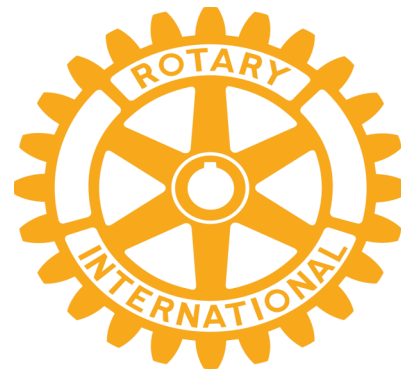

## Police Station

This morning, Captain Terry LeMaster from the Council Bluffs Police Department spoke to the club about the current police station and the reasons

for a bond proposal by the city to build a new station. Terry has been on the police force for the past 32 years. He has served in every capacity in the department. He is a Council Bluffs native having attended Thomas Jefferson High School. Terry talked



about the current station being the only station he has known as a police officer. The current station is forty (40) years old. It had an expected life span of twenty five (25) years. In short, he described not only has the force outgrown its current space but also how the facilities are not even ADA accessible. They have converted closets into offices and locker rooms. He described the current evidence room not being secured and

because of the lack of ventilation in the building, they are constantly smelling the odor of drugs, especially marijuana. He indicated parts of the building have mold and water damage. Terry talked about their inability to perform their jobs in an effective and efficient manner due to the inadequate and outdated space. On May 3, 2016 a special election will be held wherein the residents of Council Bluffs will be asked to vote on approving a twenty (20) million dollar bond to build a new station. Although the location of the building site has not been determined, he indicated the site on Woodbury Avenue seems the most promising. Terry indicated the final location would be determined by the City Council. Sixty (60) percent of the voters must approve the bond issue in order for it to pass.
