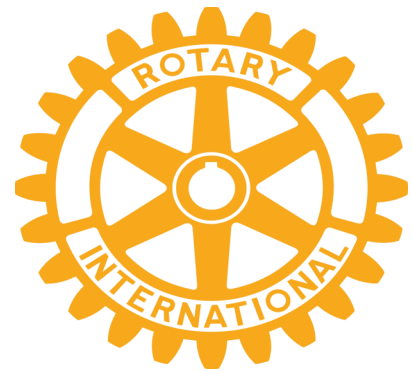

Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital

On Wednesday, John Glenn from the Madonna Rehabilitation Hospital paid us a return visit to update us on the progress being made at the new rehabilitation center being built next to Village Pointe in Omaha. He

shared that the first patient will be cared for at the new facility on October 4, 2016.

The estimated construction cost is \$93.6 million dollars.

They are trying to raise twenty percent of this amount from private donations.

The facility sits on a twenty acre campus and will be 260,000 square feet. It will hold 110 beds. Ma-

donna specializes in rehabilitation for four specific areas: spinal cord injuries, brain injuries, strokes and neurological conditions. They also offer these specialized services for children. John shared that they specialize in the top one percent of the most medically complicated cases in the country. Their goal in building the Omaha campus was to expand its footprint in the Midwest. The facility will house a research institute, a warm water pool, rehabilitation

gym, kitchen which will be used by patients to assist them in preparing for their transition home and a chapel to simply name a few of the features. The building is not designed like a traditional hospital but more like a college campus. There will be room to expand when the need arises. He indicated that they hope to be adding apartments for families to stay in during this rehabilitation period. John also shared they are partnering with UNMC in establishing a physician residency program for rehabilitation. He estimates the two year construction phase of the building will have an economic impact of \$122 million dollars. It will produce \$66 million dollars in annual revenue creating an annual economic impact of \$126 million dollars. Approximately 1,170 jobs will be created as well.
