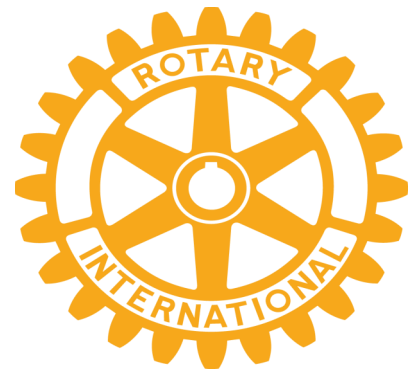

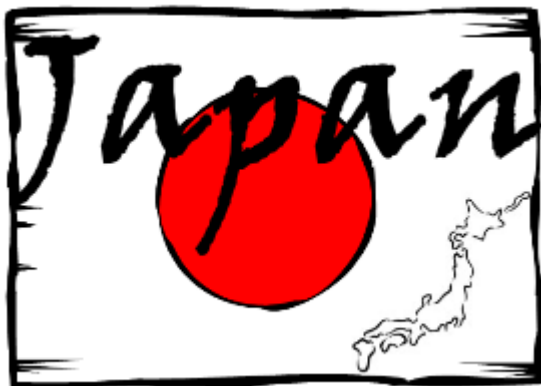
GET WELL SOON
