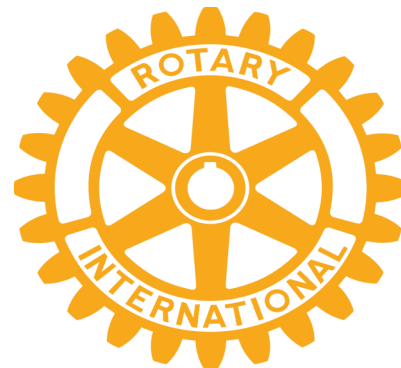

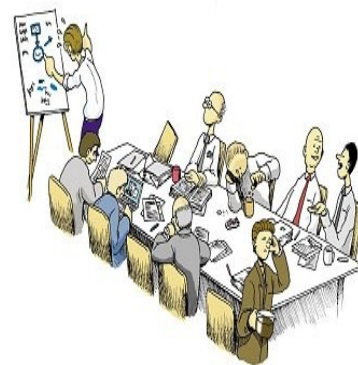

## Greeter Assignments/Program Host Assignments & Room Set - Up Assignments

Greeter: Although not new to our club but certainly new to many of our members, we will be bringing back our Greeter responsibilities. funds. The idea of a “change war” was discussed. Caitlyn shared that essentially we create collection sites at area businesses with an explanation that the funds raised go toward the ShelterBox program. Each business can come up with its own angle to help raise funds. For instance, when Caitlyn worked at the Animal Clinic, this idea was used to raise funds and theme they use was dogs vs. cats. If you preferred dogs, any extra change went into the dog fund or if you preferred cats, it went into the cat fund. She shared in a very short period of time 2-3 weeks, they raised over \$200.00. So, we are looking for your help. If you own a business, would you consider a “change war”. Dr. Cary Jackson has already indicated his business will participate. If your business is unable to assist, perhaps you can help by asking other businesses. Don't worry if you are having a difficult time coming up with a change war theme for your business as it sounds like the Rotaract group will be more than helpful in coming up with unique challenges. In addition to trying to get area businesses to help, the Rotaract group will put together the donation boxes, flyers, etc. for businesses to display. Our initial plan is to first identify businesses who are willing to participate in the change war. We are wanting to have the donation boxes in place beginning in September.
