Iowa Western Community College

This morning we heard from Matt Mancuso, Dean of Distance Education, Math and Industrial Technology at Iowa Western Community College. Matt shared that he started at Iowa Western working in the sustainability program. Several years later, he became the

Dean of Education and Pathway Development and presently serves as the Dean of Distance Education, Math and Educational Technology. His main purpose for being with us this morning was to talk about the college's new initiative to offer programs during

the evenings and weekends tailored toward working individuals wanting to obtain a degree. He shared that in the future, the plan is to offer programs on line in an effort to serve even more individuals. The goal is to allow students to complete programs without having to worry about making daytime classes. Matt shared that the college has been studying other community colleges which have branched out with evening programs. The college believed these other community colleges were having enough success with the programs that they decided to develop their own
