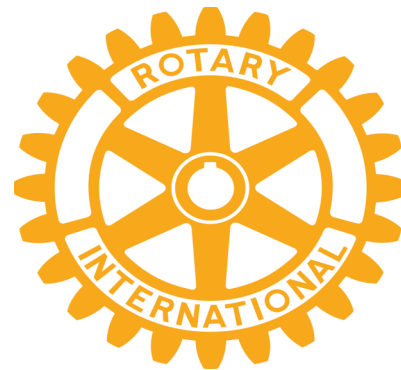

However, Dan shared this morning that this issue has been rectified and the project is now a go. He shared that the contract with the fence company has been signed and this company has agreed to erect the fence for the funds we were able to commit from the district grant. This is good news.
