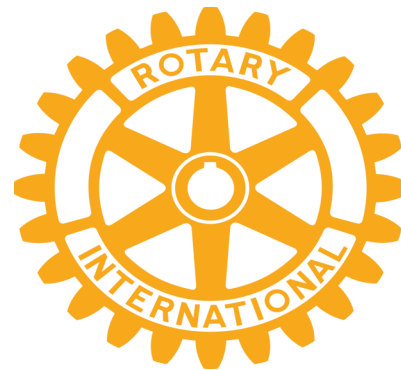

Club Assembly

We were a small but mighty group on Wednesday. As mentioned in Scott's email prior to our Wednesday meeting, the one big topic open for discussion, revolved around our club's continuation of the Cookie Crumbs project. For those new to the club, we have



been passing around the "hat" so to speak on the first Wednesday of each month collecting money to assist with postage related expenses in shipping treats and other necessities to the troops serving overseas. Our club gives \$65.00 per month toward the cause in addition to the funds collected at our meetings. Shipping parcels overseas is very expensive and this simply has been what our club has done over the years. During our club's visioning process, the cookie crumbs project was never even brought up as something the club was doing or was interested in doing going forward. So, our meeting on Wednesday was about whether or not we wanted to continue in these efforts. A suggestion was presented that we modify our giving by breaking down these monthly contributions into quarters wherein every three months we are collecting for another organization. The one proviso would be to always earmark the third

quarter for the Cookie Crumbs to assist with postage expenses around the holidays as this is by far their most expensive time of the year. During the other three quarters, the money collected would be distributed to other organizations as determined by the club. Our club would continue to donate \$65.00 per month regardless of the entity receiving the funds. The members present at the meeting were agreeable to such a change. Rather than vote at that time, it was determined we would hold things open until May 31, 2016 for anyone to present any objections to the same. If a majority of the club members do not object to this proposal, our club will implement the change. So, if you have comments, questions or concerns, please share them with Scott.

Club update

At our meeting on Wednesday, Scott gave an update to the members as to the progress our club has made as of March 31st. We have 23 members. We have given \$7,694.00 to the Foundation which ranks first in the district in per capita giving at \$366.38 per member. We have given \$966.00 to the Polio Plus program (this figure includes the April contribution made by club members). Scott reported that our club has participated in at least five different service projects. As he mentioned, we are not a big club but we are very involved!
