Greeter: Although not new to our club but certainly new to many of our members, we will be bringing back our Greeter responsibilities. the team is to ensure the team works together to help their patients make the best choices about their health.

All Care accepts all patients regardless of their income or if they are covered through health insurance. They accept payments from Medicare, Medicaid, Self pay, sliding fee along with private insurance payments.

Bill shared that in addition to their clinic located at 902 South 6th Street, they also provide outreach services to area homeless shelters in addition to services at Carter Lake Elementary. He also shared that they recently acquired dental equipment which is portable allowing them to go to the patients at these homeless shelters rather than trying to worry about the patients getting to them.

Anyone can be a patient at All Care. In fact, they are required to have a percentage of board members be patients at the clinic.
